Re-inventing Neon as 3D Sculpture

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#### Neon Flower Sculpture

Neon is an integral part of the visual culture of Hong Kong. However, until now it has been used exclusively for two dimensional signage and architectural lighting and has been mounted onto some sort of backing sheet.

Free-form sculptures in neon have been made before but these have all required many points of suspension. Jonathan Thomson's free-standing, self-supporting neon sculptures are the first to use the glass tubes of neon as both a structural and a decorative element. Like all true sculptures they are designed to be seen in the round.

These works re-invent neon as sculpture and also reinvent the language of still-life. Images of flowers have been used for centuries as metaphors to convey specific messages. Still life has also been associated with "vanitas" or "momento mori" paintings that refer to the transience of life and the inevitability of death. Making these flowers in light that can be turned off at the flick of a switch is likewise a metaphor for life and love.

Each stem is an individual work of art with its own dedicated transformer attached to the stem. Stems can be combined or arranged in any variation.

This presentation includes images of realized sculptures and paintings of other sculptures in development.

## Neon Flower Sculpture

Single Red Rose 2016 Coloured Neon 57 cm high excluding vase 80 cm high including Zaha Hadid vase

Each stem is an individual work of art with its own dedicated transformer that is hidden from view inside the vase. Stems can therefore be combined or arranged in any variation. There is only one conventional power cord connecting the work to a conventional socket. The artwork in its vase is fully self contained.




